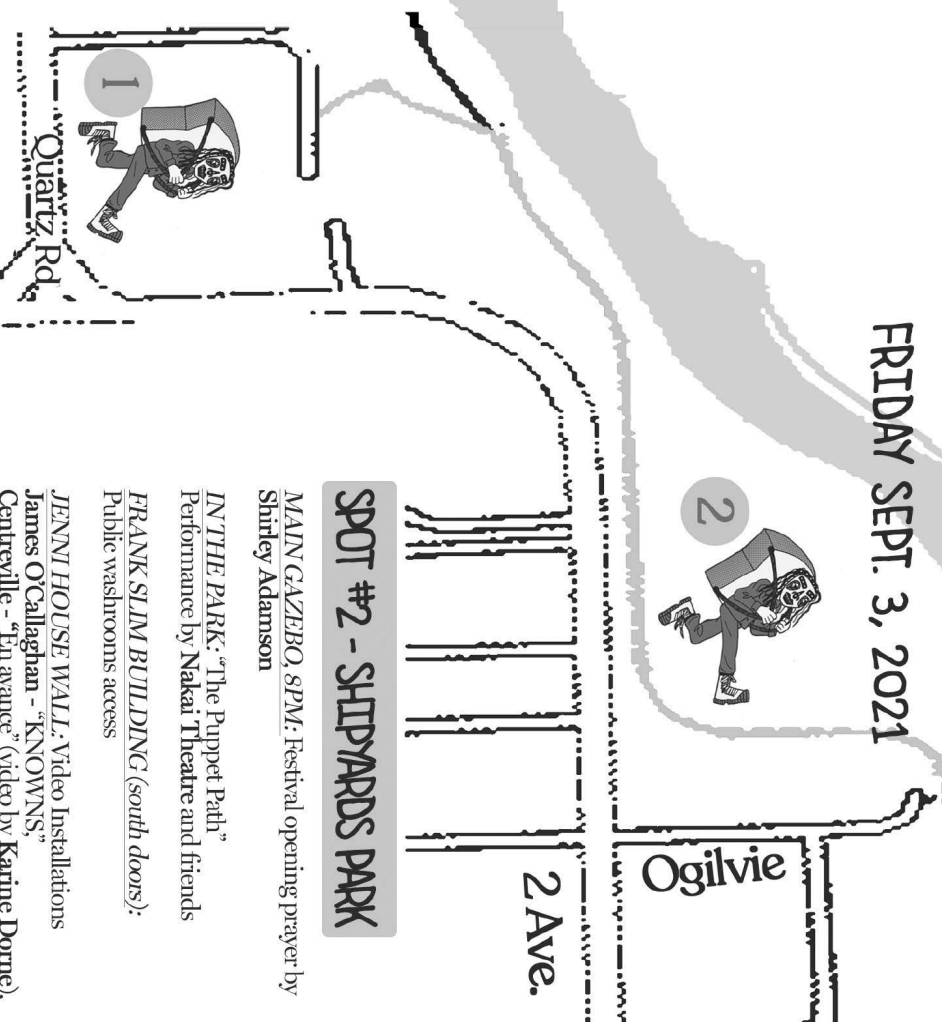

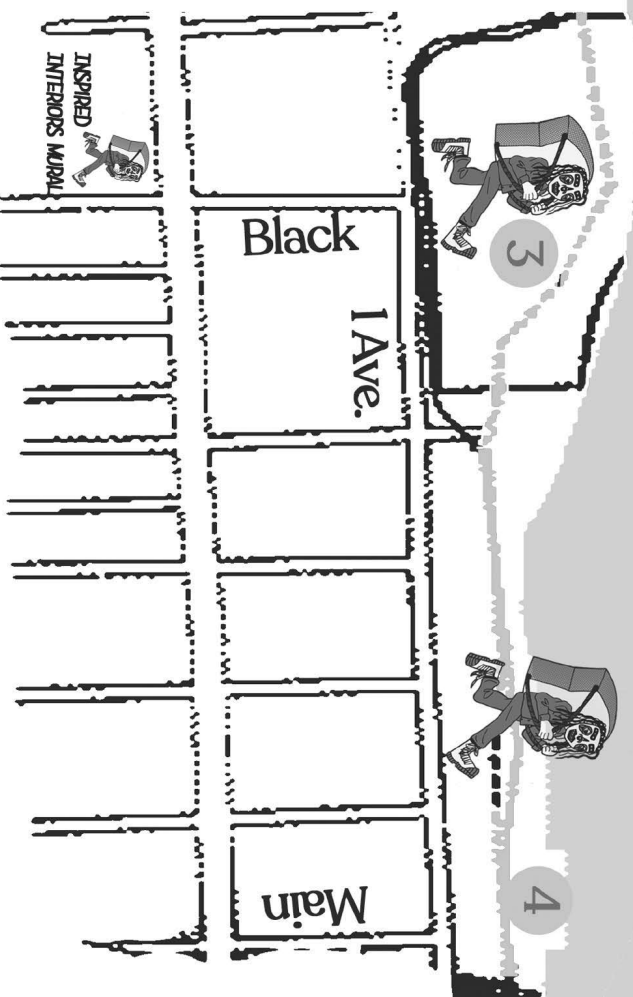

WONDERCRAWL

A FREE ALL-AGES ARTS CRAWL ALONG THE WHITEHORSE WATERFRONT

Wondercrawl is a physically distant arts crawl held along the Whitehorse waterfront between **Midnight Sun Coffee Roasters** (21 Waterfront Pl.) and the **Wharf** (1105 Front St.).

This free public event invites attendees to wander along the Millennium Trail to enjoy a number of open air installations and performances, including performances curated by local arts organizations, large video projections, and in-person art installations.

Event and Festival Opening Prayer by Shirley Adamson at 8pm at Shipyard's Main Gazebo.

The Crawl runs from 8:30pm-midnight.

SOME THINGS TO KNOW...

•There is no "correct" starting point or direction of travel for the crawl. Consider it a choose-your-own-adventure!

•Unless there are explicit signs that say it is allowed, please do not touch any of the performers and installations! People (and things!) are fragile, and we're still in a global pandemic!

•Friendly volunteers (in security green t-shirts) will be located at all the stations along the trail if you need assistance or information

•Festival Headquarters will be located for this event at the CJUC Cabin (the Chambers House) in Shipyard's Park. If you have a question or a concern that a volunteer can't help you with, come visit us there

INFORMATION

ASHWIN FREYNE Whitehorse

Ashwin and a mystery collaborator built a large wooden Pizza Photo Stand-in for Wondercrawl located Midnight Sun Coffee Roasters. Ashwin is also the lead organizer for the Whitehorse Bike Polo Tournament happening Saturday Sept. 4.

CENTREVILLE Whitehorse

Centreville is the alternative pop-rock project of Anger Ild, initiated by Jérôme (vocal, guitar) and Célie (keys, vocal), along with Jordy (drums) and Michal (bass, keys). Their album "M.A.P.S." will be released in September 2021, but three of that album's songs are being premiered at Wondercrawl! The videos were made by two documentary filmmakers who combined original and archival images (digital and Super8 formats). *Centreville's videos can be found projected onto the wall of the Jenni House.*

THE DAKKA KIWAN DANCERS Whitehorse

The Dakká Kiwáan Dancers are a National Award winning Inland Tlingit dance group based out of Whitehorse. They focus on reclaiming their languages and traditional values through their inherent art form of singing, drumming, dancing, and storytelling. Members of the group originate from all of the Interior Tlingit Nations as well as other welcomed Nations from the Southern Yukon. *The Dancers will be performing outside the KDCC at 9pm.*

DAVE ODD Carmacks

Dave Odd is an alternative artist currently based out of the deepest depths of the Yukon. The reach does not halt there though, as his songs have reached people around the world. His music is an amalgamation of unique vocal melodies, carefully crafted lyrics and immersive production. His upcoming EP "River Drive" is scheduled for release later this year. *Dave Odd's video performance is being projected onto the Library Wall.*

DUMB Vancouver

Dumb are a punk rock band from Vancouver who stubbornly refuse to live up to their name. Playing sharp, angular music that marries noisy guitars and fractured rhythms with strong, if challenging, melodies and lyrics that are full of dark wit and pointed observations. Their latest album, "Club Nites" was released by Wonderhorse partner Mint Records in 2019. *Dumb's video performance is being projected on the Library Wall.*

JAMES O'CALLAGHAN Montreal

James O'Callaghan is a composer and multimedia artist based in Montreal. His music, described as "very personal... with its own colour anchored in the unpredictable," (Goethe-Institut) intersects acoustic and electroacoustic media, employing field recordings, amplified found objects, computer-assisted transcription of environmental sounds, and unique performance conditions. *His video installation "KNOWNS" is being projected onto the wall of the Jenni House.*

JENFER JAY Whitehorse

Jenfer Jay is a lifelong artist exploring a range of different mediums to explore her experience as a disabled trans-woman living in the Yukon. Her latest project is a part of a body of work that explores the beauty through objects that have been discarded and aged. *Jenfer Jay's video installation is being projected onto the wall of Haines Packing Co.*

JOHN STOSH Mayo / Whitehorse

Marshall Buyck goes by the stage name John Stosh. He is a born and raised Yukoner and self taught beathoxer with 7 years experience. As a beathoxer he has travelled internationally to Kirilow, Poland where he placed in the top 8 in the professional and student category at the SBX Camp 7toSmoke. In 2018 he won the Yukon Rendezvous Superstar Talent Show. *John Stosh will be performing on the Wharf with Plant Daddy.*

KIM ROBERTS Marsh Lake / Whitehorse

Kim Roberts resides in Marsh Lake, Yukon. She is of Cree/Métis descent with family ties to Northern Alberta. Kim's an emerging visual artist who works in the medium of Stained Glass & Mosaics. Kim was first introduced to stained glass thru a workshop in 2009 and from there has continued to develop her skills. In recent years Kim has started selling her artwork thru local craft fairs, private sales and commissions. Kim enjoys using reclaimed/recycled materials such as barn wood, old wooden window frames, snowshoes, and antique finds. *Kim's installation will be situated near the KDCC at Fish Camp.*

LIA FABRE DIMSDALE Whitehorse

Lia is a young artist of Dehcho Dene and European ancestry, currently studying 2D animation at Emily Carr University. Lia has been working on painting a large-scale mural on the wall of Inspired Interiors over the last week. Go check it out!

THE NORTHWEST KID Saskatoon

The Northwest Kid (aka NWK) performs Alternative Hip-Hop and has been actively performing as a poet/emcee within the Canadian music scene for nearly a decade. NWK's previous releases (Mixed-Blood Mixtape, Mob Medicine, Dozy & NWK, and Transformation) have provided him with the opportunity to share the same bill with artists such as Leonard Summer, Jeremy Dutcher, The Halluci Nation, Tanya Tagaq, Buffy Sainte-Marie, Lido Pimental, and The Roots. *NWK's video performance will be projected onto the Library Wall.*

PLANT DADDY Whitehorse

Born in the frozen north, and raised in the culture that connected plant daddy to those sweet sweet vibrations at a young age! Seeking out the smoothest, finest, and freshest tunes poppin' off around the globe, it wasn't long before people and plants alike started glowing up from the music's effect! *Plant Daddy will be performing on the Wharf and Dining the Skate Comp in Carcross on Sunday Sept. 5.*

REBECCA MANTIS Whitehorse

Rebecca is a visual artist whose practice focuses on painting, printmaking, and mixed-media art. They are strongly influenced by the legitimate and fictionalized interpretations of the occult, primarily as it relates to feminism and mysticism. Rebecca received their MSc. in Contemporary Art History from the University of Edinburgh in 2010, and a BA in Visual Arts and Art History from McMaster University in 2007. *Rebecca's installation will be located in the woods along the trail.*

SADIE SEGRIF Whitehorse

Sadie Segriff is an artist and a white queer cis woman who identifies as a post-colonial Canadian settler. Her work is influenced by her northern upbringing, environmentalism, and advocating for human rights. Sadie's practice is to research human identity and expression that explores her connection to people and the natural environment around her. In April 2019, Sadie co-founded Off Course Footing, a collective creating site-specific work with pre-existing available space. In 2021, Off Course Footing produced their four-hour show In Relation at the Yukon Arts Centre. *Sadie's video installation will be shown on the wall of the Jenni House.*

SHEELAH TOLTON Whitehorse

Sheelah is an artist and architectural designer whose artwork is created in a range of mediums including ceramics, acrylics, pen and ink, graphite, and more. Throughout all formats, she draws aesthetic inspiration from boundary conditions and spatial balance – changes in light, shift of season, interplay of forms, and contrasts of material. *Sheelah's work will be at the KDCC Culture Cabins.*
